We will be operating from the General Store on the museum grounds (which is air conditioned).

Two stations will be in operation, SSB and CW.

K5A will go on the air from the SMOH General Store on Saturday, August 11, at 1300Z (8:00 am local time) and will conclude at 2300Z (6:00 pm local time).

All BVRC members are invited and encouraged to stop by and visit the station, and *operate and/or log* if you so choose.

To avoid confusion and promote fairness in operating time with this all- day event, an Operator Schedule is being arranged. Any and all BVRC members who wish to operate or assist in logging, are heartily welcomed to do so, but you must get on the Operator Schedule. The schedule will be divided into 1-hour shifts.

For the remainder of this month's Signal, we will dispense with our other regular departments in order to bring you a pictorial feature story on the happenings at BVRC Field Day 2018, held at Metfield Park June 23 – 24. Thanks to Field Day Coordinator Fred – K5QBX in supplying all the information for us, and Ron Evans-K5XK for the great pics. If you couldn't attend, you were missed and we hope you can make it next year to Field Day 2019!!!

Lots of contacts and lots of fun were experienced at BVRC Field Day 2018. Three stations, one for each of the main modes, plus a GOTA (Get On The Air) station helped to put BVRC, Bella Vista, and northern Benton County on the Field Day map.

479 QSOs were logged. An 11-year-old operated, as well as the event being attended by an assigned safety officer.

5 main antennas were used that consisted of an 80m inverted Vee, a 40m elevated vertical w/3 elevated radials, an NVIS antenna (K5SAW's design) for 80 & 40m, a linked dipole for 40 & 20m, and a 20-10m Force 12 vertical dipole. Steve-K5SAW also had his concentrically wound 40m antenna (on a 4' X 4' frame) that is tuned with a water actuated capacitor of his own design.

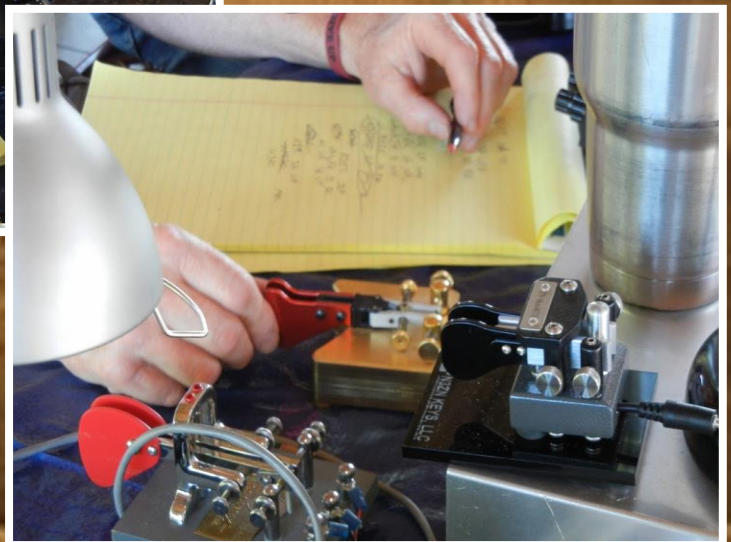

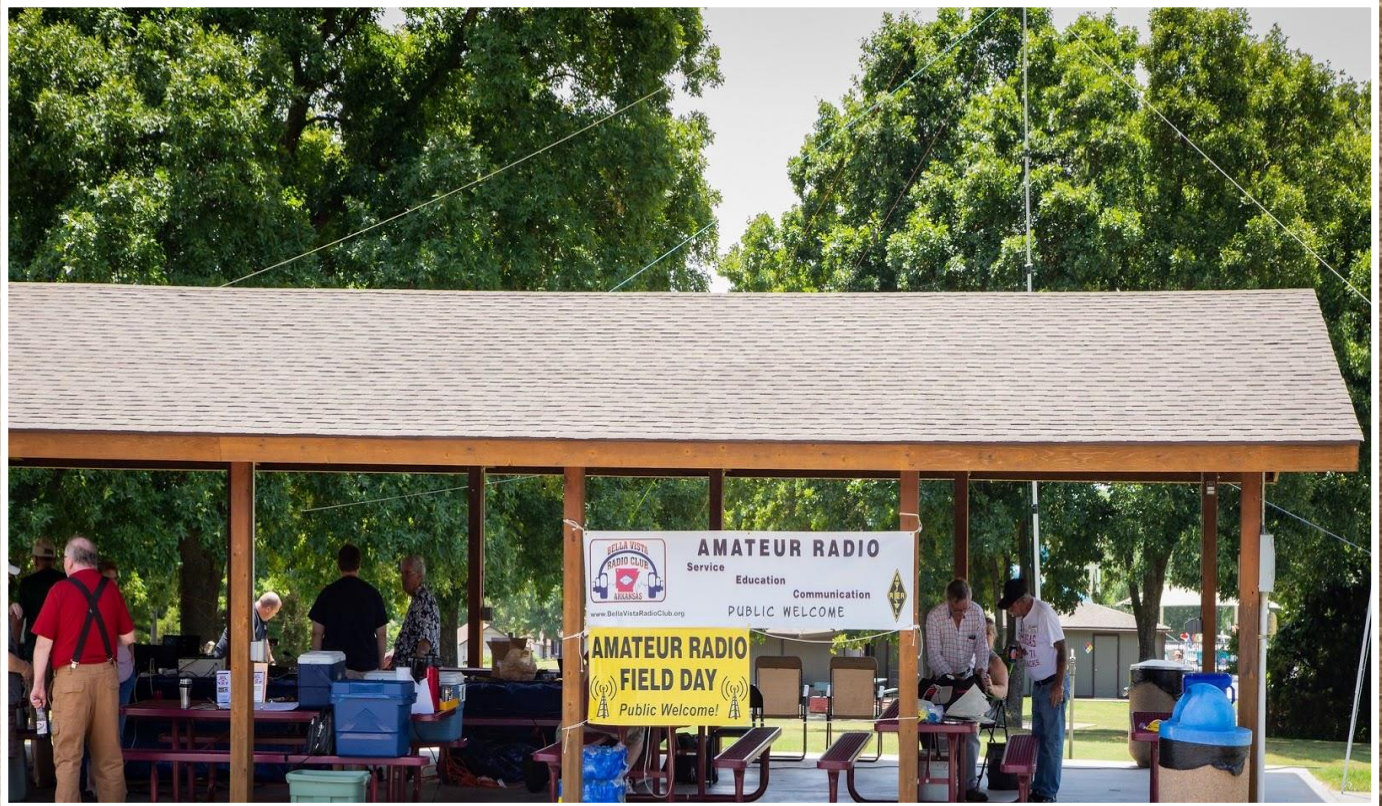
