Bill Kennamer Conducts Excellent DX Program At June Meeting

A super June program was given by Bill – K5FUV on Thursday evening, June 6. Newcomers were given some super information during the program entitled DX101, on how to work (and have fun working) DX. Bill brought along a handout that all attending could take home with them for "homework" (hi, hi). Bill is a veteran DXer, currently residing in Fayetteville, and also served at ARRL headquarters for over a decade where he assisted in ARRL's addition of computer log files for contest and DX reporting (this was the advent of the Cabrillo file), and with Logbook of The World.



Bill said that getting started on the right foot when beginning your DX experience is paramount. Some of the important steps to take are: 1) Sign-up for Logbook of The World, 2) Get a good logging program (DXLAB Suite is free, although there are other good programs, but they require purchasing, 3) Get a good contest logging program (N1MM Logger Plus is the world's most popular and it's free), 4) Get involved with FT8-it can bring big payoffs in working new countries (WSJT-X is the most popular software for this mode and it is also...free!), 5) JT Alert facilitates logging and alerts from WSJT-X (also free).

Bill shared that some of the most helpful DX websites are: QRZ.com, eQSL.com, DXWATCH.com, DXSummit.fi, dx-world.net, ClubLog.org, IOTA-world.org, IK3QAR.it, K6TU.net, and DailyDX.com.

Bill then explained the basic steps in DX operating:

1) Find a DX station. 2) Listen to the DX station – If the operator is giving instructions, comply with them. 3) Observe how the DX station is operating (running split, listening up the band, listening down the band). 4) Then, call the DX station.

As far as equipment and antennas go, Bill said a "big" station is helpful, but is not essential. A lot of DX can be worked with 100 watts.

After you've accumulated 100 different entities, you can then apply for DX awards and endorsements: DXCC, WAC, WAZ, IOTA,



etc. Thanks for a great program, Bill! We appreciate you bringing your vast but easy-tounderstand knowledge and DX material to BVRC!!!

2019 Arkansas QSO Party Summary



Even with very less than desirable conditions [again] this year, the ARQP experienced another year of continued success. 26 records were broken, with many new faces and states that we have not had participate in years past. 47 out of 50 states submitted log entries this year – a new record.

Another record was broken with 189 log entries received, up from 170 last year. Along with the 47 states, we had 3 Canadian provinces represented as well as 2 DX entities.

Our Arkansas fixed, mobile, and portable stations did a great job in activating 63 of Arkansas' 75 counties. *A <u>HUGE</u> THANKS TO ALL IN-STATERS!*

We also received numerous comments on how much fun many participants had, both in-state and out-ofstate...which is what the ARQP is all about.

BVRC made a stellar showing in this year's event as N5BVA served as a Co-Bonus Station – their first time. N5BVA tallied 461 contacts, also a new record for a Bonus Station! Several club members also participated as fixed stations, mobile stations, and manning the other Co-Bonus station, KE5XX. GREAT JOB BVRC!!!
