A couple of months ago, our own Don Banta – K5DB, expressed his passionate support of the American Radio Relay League and our club's role as an ARRL affiliated club.

Don's presentation caused me to reflect personally on just how my ARRL membership directly impacts and benefits my developing amateur radio journey. I asked myself, "Well, just what's in it for me and what do I get from my ARRL membership?"

In fact, I upload my contacts daily from my N₃FJP logging program into LotW to earn ARRL awards such as my "Worked All States" certificate and to submit for ARRL and other contests I participate in. Pursuing these are, for me, a significant part of the joy I receive from the hobby.

Bookmarked copies of "QST" and "On the Air" magazine articles and equipment reviews are piled on my desk much as an inspired cook might collect recipes for the joy of cooking. In fact, the ARRL magazines have served to broaden my interests and understanding of many facets of amateur radio that I first learned through these publications. AUGUST 2023

On the wall of my shack is a laminated copy of the amateur radio band plan that serves as a reference for my station operating as do the summaries of the ARRL contest rules I participate in.

These "real world" benefits of my ARRL membership are in addition to the broader benefits the ARRL brings to my amateur radio hobby such as promoting and advocating aggressively for our Amateur Radio Service through spectrum defense, promoting amateur radio to regulators and policymakers, as well as all the other ways where the ARRL defends, promotes, and works to grow amateur radio.

I recently renewed my ARRL membership for three more years.

I feel my membership is as important to my amateur radio hobby as the radio equipment I own!

ANNOUNCING THE ANNUAL BVRC CW ROUNDUP





Date: Saturday, August 19, 2023 Time Period: 7pm – 8pm local time (0000-0100Z, August 20) Frequency: 3.540 – 3.560 kHz

Operating classes: CLASS A – BVRC member – Experienced CW operator

- CLASS B Newcomer or newer CW operator (BVRC member or non-member)
- CLASS C Non-BVRC member Experienced CW operator
- CLASS D Listeners who copy and log only, with the use of FL Digi, code readers, etc.

CQing: Send "CQ CWR CQ CWR"

Exchange: Signal report (including operating class) / QTH (your location) / name

Example: If you are a newer CW operator and you are in QSO with K5XYZ whose signal is readable, their signal strength is registering a '7' on your S-meter and their signal tone is good, your callsign is W5ABC, you live in Bentonville, and your name is Albert, you would send something along the lines of:

K5XYZ DE W5ABC (K5XYZ this is W5ABC) BT (break)

RST IS 579 B 579 B BT

QTH IS BENTONVILLE, AR BENTONVILLE, AR BT

NAME IS ALBERT ALBERT BT

HW CPY? (How did you copy my transmission?)

K5XYZ DE W5ABC K (Over)

The other station would then reply with their information using the same format. After the exchanges are completed, short informal remarks can be made during the QSO if desired, after which the contact would end with something along the lines of:

TNX FER QSO (thanks for the QSO)

GL ES 73 (Good luck and best wishes)

K5XYZ DE W5ABC SK (end of contact)

Description of event: <u>This 1-hour event is not a contest</u>. Rather, it is a celebration of our area newcomers, returners to the mode of CW, and listeners. It is also intended to enable our veteran CW operators to enjoy helping the newcomers in making CW contacts. There are no points scored, and no results or standings posted. You do NOT have to be a member of BVRC to participate.

A handsome certificate will be issued to each participant submitting a log entry from the event.

The new Element 3 – General Class question pool went into effect on July 1, 2023. The BVRC/ARRL VE teams, as with all VE teams nationwide, now have the new Element 3 exams on hand and ready to implement.

For all persons wishing to take the General Class exam, <u>be sure you are using a</u> <u>license manual, online website, etc. that is current with the new exam pool</u>. If you use a study aid based on the old question pool prior to July 1, 2023, you will probably encounter negative ramifications when you sit for your exam.

ARRL Youth Licensing Program

The ARRL Youth Licensing Program, in effect since April 19, 2022, will cover the onetime \$35 application fee for new license candidates *17 years of age or younger* who take tests administered under the ARRL VEC program:

- After providing proof of age and passing the test, the youth candidate will be given a Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination (CSCE). They will also then complete the ARRL Youth Licensing Reimbursement form before leaving the test site. The reimbursement form will then be included with the other exam session forms and documentation to be submitted to ARRL HQ, who in turn will forward to the FCC for license issuance.
- When the youth candidate receives notice from the FCC that their new license has been issued, they will be required to pay the \$35 license fee via the FCC Universal Licensing System website out of their own funds. After remitting the fee, they will then be sent a link which will enable them to download, save, and print their new license.
- Shortly after paying the fee to the FCC (usually 1-3 weeks), the youth candidate will receive the \$35 reimbursement check from the ARRL via regular mail.

Also, youth candidates 17 years or younger will pay a reduced examination fee of \$5 (standard exam fee for candidates 18 years or older is \$15) to the BVRC/ARRL VE team at the time of the exam. Proof of under-18 status will be required at the exam session.



The July BVRC meeting was held Thursday, June 29, at ALETA in Springdale. The meeting had to be moved up one week, due to the meeting room being needed by a law enforcement class on July 6. It was once again an almost packed house. The topic for the July meeting was a review of the BVRC Field Day 2023 event that was held the weekend previous.

Field Day chair Tom Northfell-W5XNA and BVRC President Jan Hagan – WB5JAN saluted all those present at the meeting, as well as those not able to attend that evening, who served as volunteers for FD2023, which numbered over 25. It was these volunteers exhibiting their different talents in all the needed areas of operation for the event coupled with great leadership and coordination, that made BVRC Field Day 2023 one of the best Field Day's BVRC has hosted – possibly the best ever. Just shy of 100 members and guests visited the BVRC Field Day site over the weekend.
